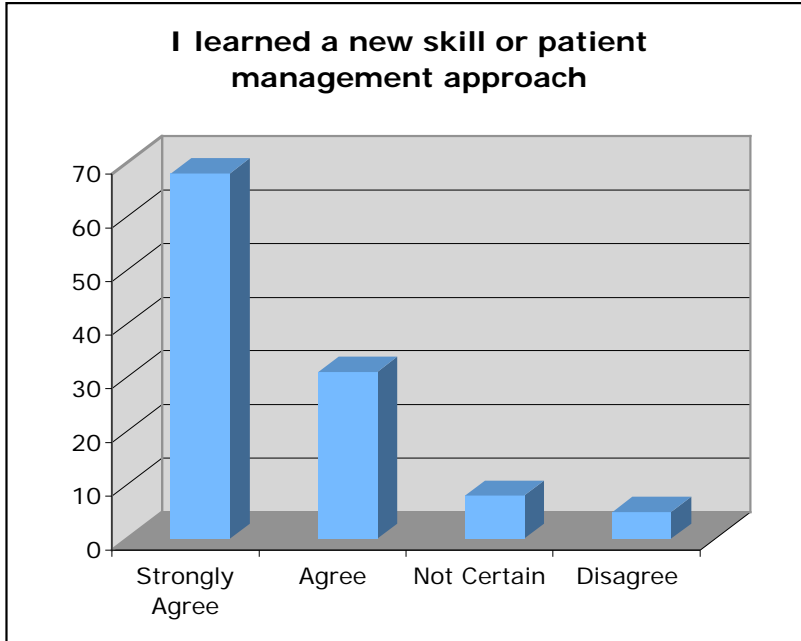

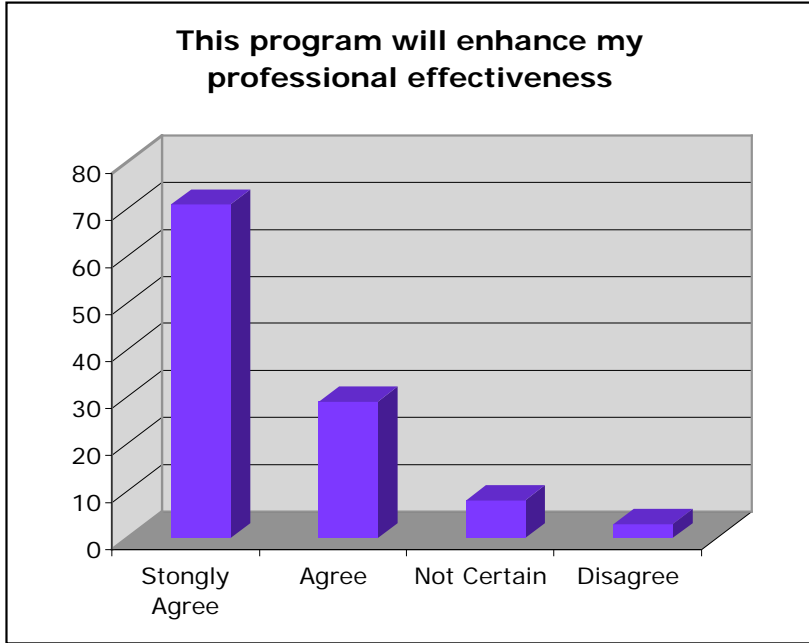
The following charts are actual data received at this seminar:
